 - 2) When requested by the Royal Canadian Legion who act on behalf of all veterans, offer localized parking considerations to support events honouring veterans that occur from time to time; and,
 - 3) The Board adopt Policy 3-13 entitled "Parking for Veterans Off-Street" (attached to staff's report).

2.0 DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION

- 2.1 Ratification of a telephone poll conducted on August 3, 2006 approving a staff memorandum dated July 28, 2006 recommending authorization of the expenditure of funds not to exceed \$25,000.00 for the construction of concrete planters in the Lakeshore Boulevard road allowance at the north/east corner of Bay Street and Lakeshore Boulevard.
- 2.2 Staff memorandum dated August 31, 2006 recommending that the landscaping improvements at Municipal Carpark 84 at 9 Salem Avenue be awarded to Tony Battista Paving Inc. for a sum total amount of \$37,400.00.

 - 3) The Board authorize the City of Toronto Works and Emergency Services Department, in its report to Council, to identify and request funding for these initiatives over and above the 2006 Capital Budget allocation in the amount of \$90,000.00. Funds are available in the Toronto Parking Authority's capital reserves which will ensure that the equipment is available to allow these proposals to proceed immediately following approval.
