## **FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION**

- 17-072 The Board received, for information only a staff memorandum dated March 16, 2017 regarding the April 30, 2017 Financial Results.
- 17-073 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 23, 2017 regarding the 2016 Audited Financial Statements of the Toronto Parking Authority for the year ended December 31, 2016 as prepared by PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP.
- The Board received, for information only, a staff memorandum dated May 23, 2017 regarding the City of Toronto Auditor General's results of the follow-up review of the "Toronto Parking Authority Pay and Display Parking Operations Review of Revenue, Expenditure and Procurement Practices".

#### **DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION**

- 17-075 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 19, 2017 recommending that the construction contract for Localized Concrete Repairs and Waterproofing for Carpark No. 52 at 40 York Street be awarded to Eagle Restoration Inc. for the amount of \$1,098,000 plus \$102,000 as contingency allowance being the sum total of \$1,200,000 plus HST.
- 17-076 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 23, 2017 recommending that the consulting services contract for the 2017 Fire Alarm, Sprinkler and Standpipe Upgrade at Carpark No. 42 91 Via Italia and Carpark No. 111 74 Clinton Street, be awarded to Morrison Hershfield Limited for the amount of \$31,500.00 plus \$3,500.00 for disbursements and an additional amount of \$5,000.00 as contingency allowance; being the sum total amount of \$40,000.00 plus HST.
- 17-077 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 19, 2017 recommending that the construction contract for Localized Concrete Repairs and Waterproofing for Carpark No. 36, Stage 2 at 110 Queen Street East, be awarded to Across Canada Construction Ltd. For the amount of \$1,794,145 plus \$155,855 as contingency allowance being the sum total of \$1,950,000 plus HST.
- The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 24, 2017 recommending that the construction contract for the 2017 Greening, Repaving and Lighting Upgrade of Carpark No. 512 at 3220 Bloor Street West be awarded to Ashland Paving Ltd. for the amount of \$171,530.68 plus \$18,469.32 as contingency allowance, being the sum total amount of \$190,000.00 plus HST.
- 17-079 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 25, 2017 recommending that the Prime Consultant Services contract for the Proposed Construction of New Second Elevator Carpark 34 Dundas Square be awarded to Entuitive Corporation for the amount of \$98,000.00 plus \$5,000.00 for disbursements and an additional amount of \$15,000.00 as contingency allowance being the sum total amount of \$118,000.00 plus HST.

#### PARKING OPERATIONS

- 17-080 The Board received, for information only, a staff memorandum dated May 12, 2017 regarding the St. Lawrence Garage Expressway Travel Time Information Pilot Project.
- The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 19, 2017, with confidential attachment, recommending the purchase, including installation, of Mechanical Vault Locks (MVLs) and Upper Cabinet Locks (UCLs) for the Authority's inventory of Pay and Display parking machines in the per-unit amount of \$156.40, for up to 2,100 MVLs and 1,800 UCLs; for a total upset value not to exceed \$609,960.00, excluding tax; from Precise ParkLink (PPL) Inc.
- The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 17, 2017 recommending that the 2017 Annual Sprinkler and Fire Alarm Inspection contract for TPA's garages be awarded to GSI Building Solutions Inc., in the amount of \$42,500.00 plus a contingency sum of \$1,000.00 for the sum total of \$43,500.00, exclusive of HST.

- 17-083 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 19, 2017 recommending that:
  - the contract for the 2017-2018 Surface Carpark Line Marking Program Sub-Tender #1 for year 2017 be awarded to Peel Pavement Marking in the amount of \$51,820.93 plus \$3,179.07 as contingency allowance, being the sum total amount of \$55,000, plus HST;
  - 2) the contract for the 2017-2018 Surface Carpark Line Marking Program Sub-Tender #2 for year 2018 be awarded to Peel Pavement Marking in the amount of \$51,587.50 plus \$3,412.50 as contingency allowance, being the sum total amount of \$55,000 plus HST; and,
  - 3) the TPA recover from the TTC the amount of \$13,356.00 (plus HST) for year 2017 and \$18,622.75 (plus HST) for year 2018, or the actual costs incurred, for Line Marking Program work carried out for the TTC parking lots.
- 17-084 The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 19, 2017 recommending that:
  - the contract for the 2017-2018 Parking Garage Line Marking Program Sub-Tender #1 for year 2017 be awarded to College Parking Liners, in the amount of \$36,445.50 plus \$3,554.50 as contingency allowance, being the sum total amount of \$40,000.00, plus HST; and,
  - 2) the contract for the 2017-2018 Parking Garage Line Marking Program Sub-Tender #2 for year 2018 be awarded to College Parking Liners in the amount of \$25,849.80 plus \$2,150.20 as contingency allowance, being the sum total amount of \$28,000.00, plus HST.
- The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 24, 2017 recommending the expenditure of funds not to exceed \$200,000 plus applicable taxes to HUB Parking Technology for the acquisition of revenue control equipment for Toronto Parking Authority's Carpark 52 (Municipal address 40 York Street).

The Board approved a staff memorandum dated May 17, 2017 recommending a sponsorship funding in the amount of \$50,000 for the 2017 Toronto Association of Business Improvement Area's ("TABIA") Citywide Campaign under the terms and conditions as detailed in staff's report.
